

## Leading From Within 2010/11

An accredited programme to develop the role, and the skills required, to become an effective middle leader in any of the phases (primary, special and secondary) of education.

### Target audience

Phase/Key Stage managers; Year Leaders; Heads of Faculty, Subject or Aspect Leaders; 2<sup>nd</sup> i/c years or subjects; or anyone aspiring to such positions.

### Purposes of the Programme

- To strengthen the standards of middle leadership in schools so that the quality of learning and teaching improve.
- To study and develop the notion of leadership in schools.
- To provide personal and professional development for teachers.

### General Information about the Programme

The key role of middle managers as leaders of school improvement practices, improving teaching and learning, and raising achievement of pupils has been shown to be vital. This programme has been designed in response to requests from schools, to meet the needs of middle managers and leaders.

### Programme Leaders

These will be the members of the School Improvement Service staff, senior leaders from each school sector and senior lecturers from Middlesex University. Each participant will also be allocated a tutor. Tutorials will be negotiated within each tutor group.

### Accreditation

The programme will be accredited through the MIDWHEB partnership with Middlesex University. Successful completion of the portfolio of evidence will count as 60 credits at Master's level. This could form the basis of a Post Graduate Certificate as the first part of an MA in Education (180 credits).

### Cost of the Programme

In order to enrol on this MA programme, the fee of £780 per person is to be paid by the school or individual directly to Middlesex University. Please note that Supply Cover costs are not included.
